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**SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAMS**

The Board of Education recognizes that the District's instructional program must be in compliance with the law to meet the identified needs of all its students. Accordingly, the regular curriculum of the District's schools is designed to accomplish the District's educational goals and objectives for a Thorough and Efficient system of education for all pupils.

When necessary, the regular program shall be altered or supplemented or other means used to provide for the identified needs of the following pupils:

- A. The classifiable educationally disabled;
- B. The gifted and talented;
- C. Those requiring compensatory or remedial programs;
- D. The disaffected and alienated;
- E. Pregnant pupils;
- F. Pupils requiring home instruction;
- G. The physically disabled;
- H. Those with limited English proficiency; and
- I. The disruptive.
